# RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND TO TOWNSHIP BOARD ADOPTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO IMPOSE A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS, LICENSES, OR APPROVALS FOR, OR FOR ANY CONSTRUCTION OF A SOLAR ENERGY PROJECT

At a meeting of the Planning Commission for the Township of Keene, Ionia County,
Michigan, held on the 6 day of January, 2025, at 7:00 p.m.:

The following preamble and resolution were offered by
and seconded by <u>Solomon</u> .

WHEREAS, Public Act 110 of 2006, MCL 125.3101 et seq., as amended, authorizes a township board to adopt and amend zoning ordinances that regulate the use of land and structures within its zoning jurisdiction to meet the needs for food, fiber, energy, and other natural resources, places of residence, recreation, industry, trade, service, and other uses of land, to ensure that use of the land is situated in appropriate locations and relationships, to limit the inappropriate overcrowding of land and congestion of population, transportation systems, and other public systems, to facilitate adequate and efficient provision for transportation systems, sewage disposal, water, energy, education, recreation, and other public service and facility requirements, and to promote public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the integration of commercial solar energy systems within the Township's existing land uses requires suitable regulations and controls to ensure compliance with the Township's Master Plan and for the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of all of the Township's residents; and

WHEREAS, Public Act 246 of 1945, MCL 41.181 *et seq.*, as amended, authorizes a township board to adopt and amend ordinances that regulate the public health, safety, and general welfare of persons and property and to codify such ordinances; and

WHEREAS, on April 24, 2023, the Township Board adopted Ordinance No. 23-4-24, which amended the Township Zoning Ordinance as it pertains to commercial solar energy systems; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 23-4-24 was published April 28, 2023.

WHEREAS, a referendum was held pursuant to the Zoning Enabling Act on Ordinance No. 23-4-24, and that ordinance was defeated in the referendum; and

WHEREAS, on November 12, 2024, the Township Board adopted Ordinance 24-11-12, again amending the Township Zoning Ordinance as it pertains to solar energy systems; and

WHEREAS, a timely notice of intent to file a petition was submitted to the Township Clerk, pursuant to the Zoning Enabling Act; and

WHEREAS, the period to file a petition regarding Ordinance 24-11-12 remains open;

WHEREAS, until the petition period has expired or until an election is held, the 2018 Commercial Solar Ordinance remains in effect, and

WHEREAS, the State of Michigan has adopted 2023 PA 233, which went into effect November 29, 2024, and makes substantial changes regarding how local governments may need to plan and/or zone for solar energy systems, and

WHEREAS, the 2018 Commercial Solar Ordinance is not a "Compatible Renewable Energy Ordinance," as defined by PA 233, so would-be developers may, as long as that ordinance is in effect, proceed under PA 233 and eventually to the Michigan Public Service Commission for a siting certificate; and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to adopt a Compatible Renewable Energy Ordinance for solar energy systems and to maintain local control over siting to the fullest extent possible under the law; and

WHEREAS, to fully evaluate, plan and/or make changes related to commercial solar energy systems, the Township Board finds that a moratorium should be imposed upon the issuance of any and all permits, licenses, and approvals for any property in the Township for the establishment and use of commercial solar energy systems until such time as Ordinance 24-11-12 or a newly adopted commercial solar energy ordinance takes effect.

WHEREAS, in order to fully evaluate, plan and/or make changes related to solar energy, the Planning Commission finds that a moratorium should be imposed upon the issuance of any and all permits, licenses, and approvals for any property in the Township for the establishment and use of Commercial Solar Energy Systems for six months or until a newly adopted commercial solar energy ordinance takes effect, whichever occurs first.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Planning Commission of the Township of Keene resolves as follows:

- 1. The Planning Commission recommends that the Township Board adopt an Ordinance to Amend the Township Zoning Ordinance to Include a Moratorium on the Issuance of Permits, Licenses, or Approvals for, or for Any Construction of, Commercial Solar Energy Projects (the "Ordinance," attached as **Exhibit A**).
- 2. The Ionia County Planning Commission has waived its rights to review rezoning or text amendments.
- 3. A copy of the Ordinance shall be available for examination at the office of the Clerk, and copies may be provided for a reasonable charge.

### **EXHIBIT A**

#### KEENE TOWNSHIP

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWNSHIP ZONING ORDINANCE TO INCLUDE A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS, LICENSES, OR APPROVALS FOR, OR FOR ANY CONSTRUCTION OF, COMMERCIAL SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS

#### **KEENE TOWNSHIP ORDAINS:**

Section 1. Amendment to Section 15.50 of the Township Zoning Ordinance

Section 15.50 of the Zoning Ordinance is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

## Section 15.50 Moratorium on Commercial Solar Energy Systems

- A: **Definitions**. The following definitions apply to this Section:
  - 1. A "Commercial Solar Energy System" is utility-scale commercial system that converts energy into electricity, whether by photovoltaics (PV) or various experimental solar technologies, for the primary purpose of wholesale or retail sales of generated electricity.
- B. <u>Purpose and Findings</u>. The purpose of this moratorium is to provide sufficient time for the Keene Township Planning Commission and Township Board to fully and thoughtfully explore, analyze, research, and make informed decisions regarding Commercial Solar Energy Systems. In support of this Ordinance, the Keene Township Planning Commission and Township Board have determined the following:
  - 1. The referendum election rejection of Ordinance No. 23-4-24 and the notice of intent to file a petition on Ordinance No. 24-11-12 leaves the Township's 2018 Commercial Solar Energy Ordinance in effect.
  - 2. The integration of Commercial Solar Energy Systems within the Township's existing land uses requires suitable regulations and controls to ensure compliance with the Township's Master Plan and for the protection for the health, safety, and welfare of all Township residents
  - 3. The State's adoption of 2023 PA 233, and the referendum activity surrounding the Township's recent attempts to adopt a solar ordinance, requires proper planning and response.
  - 4. The Township wishes to consider whether new amendments to its Zoning Ordinance to regulate the establishment and use of Commercial Solar Energy Systems are reasonable and necessary in order to better protect the public health, safety, and welfare of Township residents.

5. In light of these events, it is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of Township residents to impose a moratorium, on a limited temporary basis, to allow the Planning Commission to fully and thoughtfully explore, analyze, research, and develop any new proposed zoning amendments applicable to Commercial Solar Energy Systems.

6. A moratorium should therefore be imposed upon the issuance of any and all permits, licenses, and approvals for any property in the Township for the establishment and use of Commercial Solar Energy Systems until Ordinance 24-11-12 or a new solar energy ordinance takes effect.

C: <u>Moratorium</u>. A moratorium is hereby imposed upon the issuance of any and all permits, licenses, or approvals for any property in the Township for the establishment and use of Commercial Solar Energy Systems, so long as this Ordinance is in effect.

**D.** <u>Term of Moratorium; Renewal.</u> The moratorium imposed by this Ordinance remains in effect for 6 months (6-30-25) following publication or until Ordinance No. 24-11-12 or a new solar energy ordinance takes effect, whichever occurs first.

## Section 2. Validity and Severability.

If a court of competent jurisdiction finds any portion or portions of this Ordinance invalid, the remaining portions of this Ordinance will remain in effect.

# Section 3. Repealer.

Any ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect while it is in effect.

## Section 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance takes effect upon the expiration of 7 days after publication, or as otherwise provided by law.
